


Question: Is there a way to quickly select all cells on a sheet that contain a formula?

Answer: Yes, using the 'Go To' option

Process (Excel 2003 and 2007):

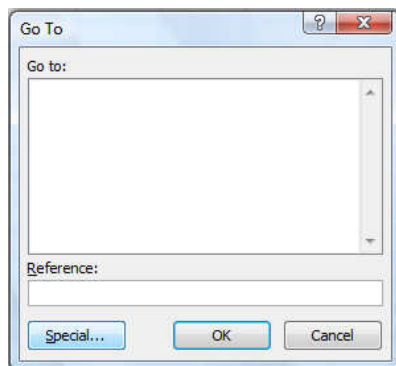
Without selecting a cell itself and viewing the contents of the cell in the Formula Bar, there is no way for you to see if a cell contains a formula. This example will demonstrate how to select all cells that contain formula at one time.

I have set up a worksheet that contains formulas in cells, B2 (SUM function), C3 (AVERAGE function), D4 (MIN function) and E5 (MAX function):

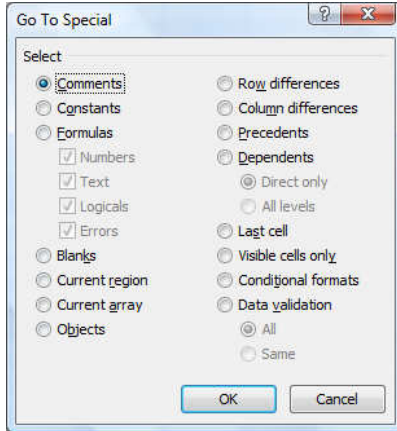

1. Press **F5** or use the keyboard shortcut **Ctrl + G**. This will bring up the **Go To** dialog box



2. Click **Special**



3. Select the **Formulas** radio button and click **OK**

Every cell on the sheet that contains a formula is now selected. You are free to use any of the Formatting functions to further highlight the cells.
